FIFTEEN-YEAR INDEX TO THE BULLETIN 1965-1979

This index has entries for authors, common and scientific names of birds, geographic localities (Kansas counties and states other than Kansas), and a limited number of special subjects. Common and scientific names of birds are those accepted by the American Ornithologists' Union (Check-list of North of American Birds, Fifth Edit., 1957, and supplements published in *The Auk*). Subject headings have been defined broadly and include: Albinism, Anomaly, Banding returns, Behavior, Breeding, Color analysis, Count, Food and feeding habits, Fossil, Habitats, Hybrids and hybridization, Molts and plumages, Mortality, Nests and nest sites, Parasitism (nest), Physiology, Roosting, and Weights and measurements.

We did not index each and every bird species listed in certain articles, when such would have involved numerous entries leading to no new information. If authors of these articles made special comments about any species, those species were included. The articles so treated were: all of those listed in this index under "Count," Birds of the Dingus Natural Area (27:34-35); Composition of woodland bird communities (28:13-18), More birds that came to see me (28:33-36), and Recent TV tower kills at Goodland, Kansas (28:10-12).

Notes regarding binding.—The first Fifteen-year Index (for 1950-1964) was published as Number 3 of Volume 18. A limited number of copies of that issue are still available for persons or institutions who wish to bind that index at the end of the first fifteen volumes or at the end of Volume 30. The present index is published as Number 4 of Volume 30, so it can be bound, in place, at the end of the volumes it indexes. Persons binding these volumes should note that certain pages do not have adequate inner margins to permit binding without loss of some printed material in the spine, unless special binding procedures are used (see, for an example of this problem, pages 4 and 5 of volume 29).
